Goal #1 Maximize Academic Performance of All Students

- Disaggregate CBA's and TAKS scores to identify and prescribe needed interventions
- Continue with the McMillan Mentoring Program pairing teachers and staff with students in need
- Continue with the "ZAP" program where zeroes are not permitted
- Hold mandatory afternoon tutorials while providing transportation home for students in need
- Continue working with the RESULTS committee in identifying students and prescribing academic interventions

Goal #2 Increase Student Engagement by Providing Quality Professional Learning Opportunities for All Employees

- Teachers will continue to weekly with curriculum groups to plan, evaluate lessons
- Teachers will continue to receive instruction in using CP+ and utilizing all functions
- Teachers will be provided with necessary supplies and equipment to provide engaging lessons
- Teachers will be given the opportunities to attend workshops and professional learning opportunities
- Students will be engaged in video conferencing activities

Goal #3 Recognize McMillan Employees Through Appreciation and Enhanced Incentives
