MJH Discipline Plan	
Violation	Consequence
1st Violation	Warning
2nd Violation	30 minute teacher-held detention. Parent contact.
3rd Violation	Office Referral: Administrator discretion
Further Violations	Office Referral: Administrator discretion

The consequences for the first three violations may be bypassed, and students may be referred directly to the office for flagrant misbehaviors (example: use of profanity, insubordination, fighting).

- Consequences for missing a school detention: Evening School
- Consequences for missing an Evening School: In-School Suspension (ISS)

Tardies

Tardies will be recorded each class period (per class, per semester). **If a student is not in the classroom when the tardy bell rings, they will be considered tardy.** A tardy of more than 15 minutes will be considered an absence.

Students who arrive late to school must obtain an admit slip to class from the attendance office. In order for the tardy to be excused a student must bring a note from a parent/guardian or doctor within **72** hours.

Tardies	
Number of Tardies	Consequence
1	Warning to student
2	30 minute teacher-held detention and parent contact
3	3 hour Evening School + Parent Contact Teacher assigned
4	3 hour Evening School + Parent Contact Teacher assigned

Dress Code- See standardized dress code policy.

Students who violate the dress code will be subject to the following:

Dress Code	
Violation	Consequence
1	On the first violation, the student will receive a warning . The student will be given the opportunity to change clothes at school. If the violation is not corrected, the student will be placed in ISS for the remainder of the day. Parents will be notified of the violation.
2	On the second violation, the student will be assigned an Evening School . The student will be given the opportunity to change clothes, and parents will be notified. If the student does not correct the violation, the student will be placed in ISS for the remainder of the day.
3	Any subsequent violations of the dress code will result in more serious disciplinary actions, which may include In-School Suspension (ISS) and or assignment in the district's Disciplinary Alternative Education Program (DAEP).

Late Work/Zeros

Late Work / Zeros	
Violation	Consequence
1	A student may turn in homework for a late grade within 24 hours of the original due date for a maximum score of 70% . The maximum number of late works is 3 per class, per six weeks. Any additional late works will result in an automatic evening school. GT/WINGS and Pre- AP 7th/8th grade students are permitted 1 late work per six weeks.
2	If a student fails to turn in assignment, the teacher may assign a mandatory tutorial . Tutorials must be served within 24 hours. The maximum grade received for completing the assignment with an assigned tutorial will be 65% .
3	If a student fails to attend the tutorial and/or complete the assignment, he or she will be assigned 3 hours of evening school for a maximum score of 60% .

Late Projects are not accepted

Cell Phones/Electronic Devices	
Violation	Consequence
1	On the first violation the student will be assigned a lunch detention and a parent or guardian must retrieve the device.
2	On the second violation the student will receive an evening school . There is a \$15 charge to retrieve the device and a parent or guardian must retrieve the device.
3	On the third violation the student will be assigned ISS . There is a \$15 charge and a parent or guardian must retrieve the device.
