

School Parent & Family Engagement Policy

Birmingham Elementary 2021-2022

Birmingham Elementary will take the following actions to:

 - *Inviting parents to meet before the start of the school year to learn about their child's upcoming curriculum learning.*

3. Provide opportunities for parents to participate, as appropriate, in decisions about the education of their children.
 - *Parents participation in ARD decisions*
 - *Parents participate in RtI decisions*
 - *Parent-Teacher conferences in the fall and spring semesters*

4. Provide each parent an individual student report about the performance of their child on the State assessment in math, language arts and reading by:
 - *Provide BOY MAP assessment scores at parent/teacher conferences*
 - *Send MOY and EOY assessments scores with letter explaining how to read scores home to parents*
 - *Send STAAR reports out in a timely manner when received by TEA.*

5. Give parents timely notice when their child has been taught for four (4) or more consecutive weeks by a teacher who is not certified.
 - *Human Resources will notify the school principal of certification requirements and provide the campus with a letter to send home to parents.*

6. Provide assistance to parents in understanding the following topics:
 - *the state's academic content standards,*
 - *the state's student academic achievement standards,*
 - *the state and local academic assessments including alternate assessments,*
 - *how to monitor their child's progress, and*
 - *how to work with educators:*
 - *Parent information night*
 - *Curriculum Night*
 - *Parent-Teacher conferences*
7. Provide materials and training to help parents work with their children to improve their children's academic achievement and to increase parental involvement, by:
 - *Parents volunteers as Teachers*
 - *Family Literacy Night*
8. Educate its staff in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners.
 - *Parent involvement training provided at the district level*
 - *Teachers and parents invited to attend Title I Parent Involvement Conference*
9. Ensure that information related to parent programs, meetings, and other activities is sent to parents in an understandable format, various mediums, and to the extent practicable, in a language the parents can understand:
 - *Weekly newsletter sent out*
 - *Online newsletter posted*
 - *Seesaw*
 - *Regular School-wide community assembly*
10. To the extent feasible and appropriate, coordinate and integrate parental involvement programs and activities with Head Start, Reading First, Early Reading First, Even Start, Home Instruction Programs for Preschool Youngsters, the Parents as Teachers Program, public preschool, and other programs. The school will also conduct other activities, such as parent resource centers, that encourage and support parents in more fully participating in the education of their children, by:
 - *Coordinating with the district Director of Special Services and Federal Programs Coordinator to ensure coordination and integration between federal, state and local programs where applicable.*
