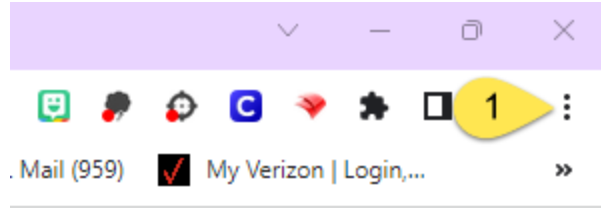


Changing PDF's to open inside Chrome or Download

- Click on "Privacy and security" and then click on the arrow next to Site settings



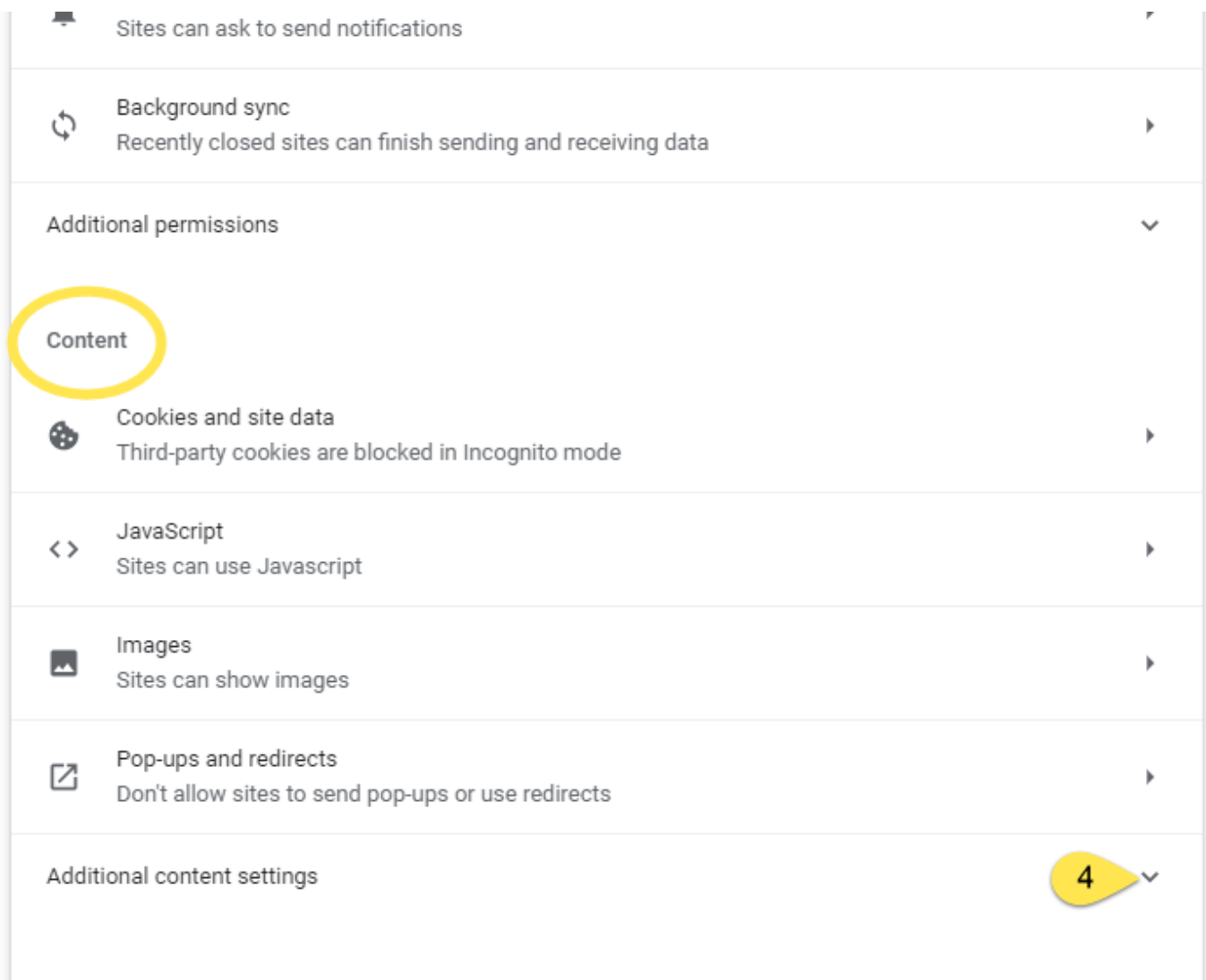
